

At the Request of Benj<sup>r</sup> Murdock the following

Deed was recorded 29 November 1825 to wit,

This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty five between Robert Darnall of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland of the one part and Benjamin Murdock of the County, and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Robert Darnall for and in consideration of the sum of Eight thousand nine hundred and sixty Dollars current money of Maryland, to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold, aliened, released enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents, the said Robert Darnall doth grant bargain and sell alien release enfeoff and confirm unto the said Benjamin Murdock and his heirs, all the following described piece or parcel of land being part of a tract of Land called "The Hope" or by whatever name it may be called of which Thomas Darnall, father of the said Robert, died seized lying in Frederick County aforesaid Beginning for the part hereby intended to be conveyed, at a Stone planted at the end of Eighteen perches and the nine tenths of a perch on the south line of that part of the survey on Hope which was conveyed by Thomas Darnall to Thomas Sprigg by deed bearing date the twenty sixth day of April Seventeen hundred and ninety three and running thence with the original location of the said Thomas Sprigg part the two following courses and distances South forty six and three quarter degrees East Ninety Nine and one tenth perches to a planted Stone South Seventy four degrees and three quarters East one hundred and Ninety six perches to a Stone planted on the North fifteen degrees West eighty five and a half perches line of a tract of Land called "Sand Lasee Hill" then with the said line allowing half a degree for variation North fifteen and a half degrees West Sixteen and a half perches to a Stone planted on the twenty fifth line of the survey on the Hope as marked and bounded by companions about Seventeen or Eighteen years ago: then with the outlines of said land agreeably to the said Marking and bounding thereof the three following courses and distances South Seventy six degrees East twelve perches to a Stone planted and marked N<sup>o</sup> 25,
